How does this affect the country?	<p>The impact of rollbacks on this country cannot be overstated; Trump's administration has given the OK to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Permit unregulated release of methane from venting, flaring, and leaks in oil production. ● Sell uninspected meat if produced outside of normal hours of USDA inspection. ● Build cars that pollute more. ● Release drug companies from agreements to limit prices under Section 340B. ● Block, slowdown, or charge extra for internet bandwidth based on content. ● Propose expansion of oil and gas drilling in the outer continental shelf (see Deepwater Horizon oil spill disaster). ● Allow a media company to own all newspapers, TV and radio stations in the same town (i.e monopoly). ● Require the elderly to sign binding arbitration agreements to enter nursing homes. ● Allow persons diagnosed as mentally disabled to buy guns. ● Permit coal companies to dump waste within 100 feet of streams and other water sources. ● Extort foreign countries to help Trump's re-election campaign
